This project has always been managed from Mesquite, NV, with the managers and employees spending time in the desert. This process has been hard on families, relationships and has not worked well in the long run for the project. Dry camping, while enjoyable to some, can become tedious after awhile. We need to address the long term mental and physical health of our employees and the overall strength of this project. We are making great gains over the population control in this region but we must continue our work or all will be lost.

Rebecca is the right person to lead the WBP into the future and this plan will aide her in having the right people with the right attitude towards the donkeys. We are five years into the project and have acquired 1004 total donkeys either from direct capture or from their babies. My plan is for the next five years and hopefully longer.

Purchase 2 bumper pull camper trailers, each with a separate bedroom and sleeping accommodations for at least 4 people. Place one in the RV Park at Fort Irwin and one at a RV Park in Pahrump, NV. The one that we currently own needs some refurbishment but will be kept at Furnace Creek in Death Valley.

We advertise for employment through college employment websites, Rebecca's idea. These students would stay in the RV while working on Irwin. They would camp while working in Death Valley but be able to rest in Pahrump in the RV on their days off. I have hired my oldest son Steven and his friend as weekend help. They both work four day weeks and are available to fill in as needed.

Rebecca can bounce between all capture locations and keep on eye on all operations. The bedroom in both new campers would be hers and hers alone. The Camper at Furnace Creek would be for whoever was babysitting the captured donkeys awaiting bloodwork. During the off season, Rebecca can live on the ranch in Texas.
